This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Hillsborough at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Hillsborough lies 3.5 miles north west of Sheffield city centre. For local government purposes part was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Wortley Rural District until 1901 when it was incorporated into Sheffield under the Sheffield Corporation Act of 1900.

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via www.Ancestry.com

Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Hillsborough-based clubs, societies and charities; for instance:

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Sheffield Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

As Hillsborough was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1901, older records may be at West Yorkshire Archives.

Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, "Plan and particulars of valuable leasehold stone-built family residence known as Walcot House, fronting to Langsett Road, Hillsborough and eligible freehold building plots having extensive frontages to Langsett Road", 1892 (Sheffield Local Studies Library: 10 May 1892)

In addition there are planning applications for Sheffield city (Sheffield Archives: CA206) and Wortley Rural District Council registers of building plans and plans, 1877-1936 (Sheffield Archives: CA212, CA467, CA676).

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

As Hillsborough was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1901, some land, building and property records may be at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

Poor Law, Civil Parish and Local Government records

Hillsborough was in the Wortley Poor Law Union (established in 1838) and Wortley Rural District until 1901 when it was incorporated into Sheffield under the 1900 Sheffield Corporation Act. Thereafter Hillsborough was in the Sheffield Poor Law Union.

Schools

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material:

For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire there may be relevant records at the West Yorkshire Archives Service.

Prior to 1914, Hillsborough came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Hillsborough prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record.
