This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Norton at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Norton lies 4 miles south of Sheffield City Centre. Originally a village in Derbyshire it was transferred to the City of Sheffield in two parts in 1901 and 1933.

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via www.Ancestry.com

Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

Norton St James is an ancient parish.

St Paul's Norton Lees was consecrated in 1877, and originally had jurisdiction over the parish of Norton Woodseats (a parish formed out of Norton in 1874). The parish came to be known as Norton Lees at some time before the new parish of St Chad, Norton Woodseats was constituted in 1912.

The ecclesiastical parish of St Chad's Norton Woodseats was formed out of the parishes of Norton and Norton Lees and from the liberty of Beauchief. The church was consecrated in 1912.

Diocese of Sheffield, faculties from 1914 onwards (these detail changes made to Anglican church buildings) (Sheffield Archives: DIOC/FAC)

Norton was originally a parish in the Diocese of Lichfield and later in the Diocese of Southwell (created 1884). When the parish was transferred to Sheffield, it was also transferred to the Diocese of Sheffield.

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. (Sheffield Archives: MC)

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield Archives: QS)

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, plans and particulars of valuable freehold mansion, dwelling-houses, farms, woods, woodlands and other properties at Norton, etc., 1879 (Sheffield Local Studies Library: 2 Dec 1879).

In addition there are a few planning applications from Norton Rural District Council, (Sheffield Archives: CA207 and CA208 and CA214), as well as Sheffield City Council

(Sheffield Archives: CA206). There may also be planning applications at <u>Derbyshire</u> Record Office.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers.

For example, deeds and papers of the Newton Shawe family of Norton, from the 13th century onwards (*Sheffield Archives: NSC*) and Bagshawe Family of Oakes-in-Norton (Oakes Deeds), 18th century onwards (*Sheffield Archives: OD*).

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal other relevant entries.

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. Newspapers

The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Also available is the *Eckington*, *Woodhouse and Staveley Express and North Derbyshire and South Yorkshire Advertiser*, 1899 - 1940.

Court records will be held at the <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u> and at the <u>National</u> Archives.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record.</u>
